Recognized under Article 366(25) and Article 342, these communities constitute 8.6% of the population and have played a vital role in India's history, ecology, and knowledge systems. Despite constitutional safeguards, they continue to face land alienation, displacement, and socio-economic challenges. This conference aims to explore constitutional, legal, social, and policy dimensions of tribal rights, addressing the gap between legal provisions and ground realities. It invites interdisciplinary research and discussions to ensure a holistic understanding of tribal experiences in modern India.


